

Resolution PA2505 – 06

Strengthening Jewish Unity: Commitment to Shared Responsibility and Resilience

The 17th Plenary Assembly of the World Jewish Congress, meeting in Jerusalem on 18 – 20 May 2025

RECALLS PA 2105-3 and reaffirms its commitment to the principles outlined in that resolution;

RECOGNIZES that despite the inherent diversity within the Jewish community, including expressions of political and religious conviction, which should be celebrated, Jewish unity is not only a moral imperative but also a vital matter of survival, as it ensures the strength and resilience of the Jewish people in the face of adversity and promotes open and respectful dialogue that fosters mutual understanding, collective responsibility, and the principle of *Kol Yisrael Arevim Zeh Bazei* —"All Jews are responsible for one another."

RECOGNIZES with pride and appreciation the unwavering support demonstrated by international Jewry for Israel, and by Israel towards the international Jewry, following the terrorist attacks of October 7th, through identification, advocacy, unified action and philanthropy;

ACKNOWLEDGES the role of the World Jewish Congress as a unifying force, and a convener of Jewish communities worldwide to strengthen commitment and solidarity and to define, facilitate and promote collective action in addressing the challenges facing the Jewish world and Israel;

ENCOURAGES the development of initiatives that engage unaffiliated or disengaged individuals of Jewish background, ensuring that Jewish involvement is inclusive and accessible to all, regardless of political religious or cultural background;

ENCOURAGES greater focus on and access to education amongst member communities, on Jewish resilience, history including Zionism, traditions, and values, so as to strengthen understanding and development of Jewish identity, to equip young Jewish leaders to counter misinformation, advocate for Zionism and the State of Israel, and to ensure the continuity of Jewish peoplehood with confidence, clarity, and historical accuracy and to promote unity and understanding of the depth of our shared heritage for future generations.
