Cami Tussie was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina and moved to Miami, Florida when she was four. She graduated from Stanford University with a BS in Bioengineering and a minor in Political Science in 2021; in the fall, she will join Harvard School of Dental Medicine's Class of 2025.

She's currently the COO of Start Up Nation Mentorship, an organization that works with the WJC to match college students from across the world with executive mentors in Israel who have excelled in the student's dream career. Through this program, Cami works to introduce students who would have never otherwise had exposure to Israel to the bustling Israeli start-up culture.

Cami has always been thoroughly involved in Jewish organizations, becoming the co-President of Stanford's Israel Association and the Vice President of Stanford's Jewish Student Association while at Stanford.

She was a Ronald S. Lauder Fellow from 2019-2020, an Israel on Campus Coalition Grinspoon Fellow, and a StandWithUs Emerson Fellow.

As the recipient of the Campus Pitch Competition, she led a trip of Stanford students to Argentina to study Jewish life in Latin America, attended the 75th Anniversary of the Auschwitz Liberation with the WJC delegation, and led a trip of 20 non-Jewish Stanford students to Israel, the West Bank, and surrounding territories to study the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.
