Internship Description:

Intern will assist with general tasks within the Communications department, writing stories for the website, researching news items, shadowing staff, and learning the basics of how communications operate. In addition to facilitating projects as needed, Intern will particularly focus on expanding and improving digital projects, specifically the recently launched AboutHolocaust.org and the annual #WeRemember campaign.

As WJC broadens the reach of these projects, intern will focus on analyzing existing networks within the sporting world and evaluate opportunities for growth.

- Research abilities and data analysis.
- Familiar with web design and developing content.
