

- Approx. 100 Jewish Diplomats (JDs) representing 34 countries
- Engages in practical diplomatic advocacy addressing the needs of global Jewry, extending the reach and scope of the WJC

## **Mission**

Implement a global and regional strategy to best impact the preparatory process and maximize outcomes during the conference

### **Method**

- Map the relevant players
- Identify potential strategic partners
- Create working alliances with NGOs and civil society organizations to counter anti-Israel or anti-Semitic initiatives







## **Task Force Activities**

- Mapping policies of NGOs, governments and Jewish organizations
- Participation in Regional Preparatory Meetings (e.g. Abuja, Geneva)
- Lobbying NGOs, governmental representatives and UN officials

## **Selected Task Force Achievements**

- African Regional Meeting:
  - Refocused the conference agenda
  - Negotiated changes to the final NGO document, preventing Israel from being unfairly singled-out
  - Nurtured relationships to enable future cooperation



## Israel:

Ministry of Foreign Affairs and other Jewish organizations <u>embrace</u> <u>WJDC recommendations</u> for preparatory approach to conference

- Geneva Working Group Meeting:
  - Effective advocacy of Jewish concerns with numerous government and NGO delegations
  - Contribution of best practices and recommendations to be incorporated in final declaration
  - Cooperation and coordination with major civil society actors

# **Key Messages**

- Advocate your concerns to your government and local NGOs
- No singling out of any one state for condemnation or demonization
- No re-opening of the first Durban Declaration in order to remove the anti-Semitism condemnation, Holocaust denial or the call for Holocaust commemoration
- No hierarchy of racisms all forms of racism and discrimination are to be fought equally

## **Recommendations to the Plenary**

Connect and engage JDs with their regional Jewish leadership and follow-up on existing achievements
