Argentine AMIA Attack

The Executive Committee of the World Jewish Congress, meeting in Washington, DC on 23 March 2015,

LAMENTS the lack of progress in bringing to justice the perpetrators of the 1994 Argentine Israelite Mutual Association (AMIA) bombing in Buenos Aires, in which 85 people were murdered;

URGES the Government of Argentina to enhance its efforts in pursuing and holding accountable the parties responsible for the gruesome terrorist attack on AMIA and end more than two decades of inconclusiveness;

EXPRESSES unconditional support for the efforts undertaken by the DAIA and AMIA;

REAFFIRMS its concerns that Argentina's Memorandum of Understanding with Iran will continue to inhibit any further elucidation of the criminal actions that led to this tragedy;

CONVEYS its concern and regret for the suspicious death of prosecutor Alberto Nisman, who had relentlessly pursued justice for the victims of the AMIA attack, and calls upon the Argentinian authorities to expeditiously clarify these circumstances;

INSISTS that the Government of Argentina build upon the progress made in the investigation prior to Mr. Nisman's death, and that it embrace the spirit of justice for the victims of those murdered and injured in Argentina's deadliest terrorist bombing.
